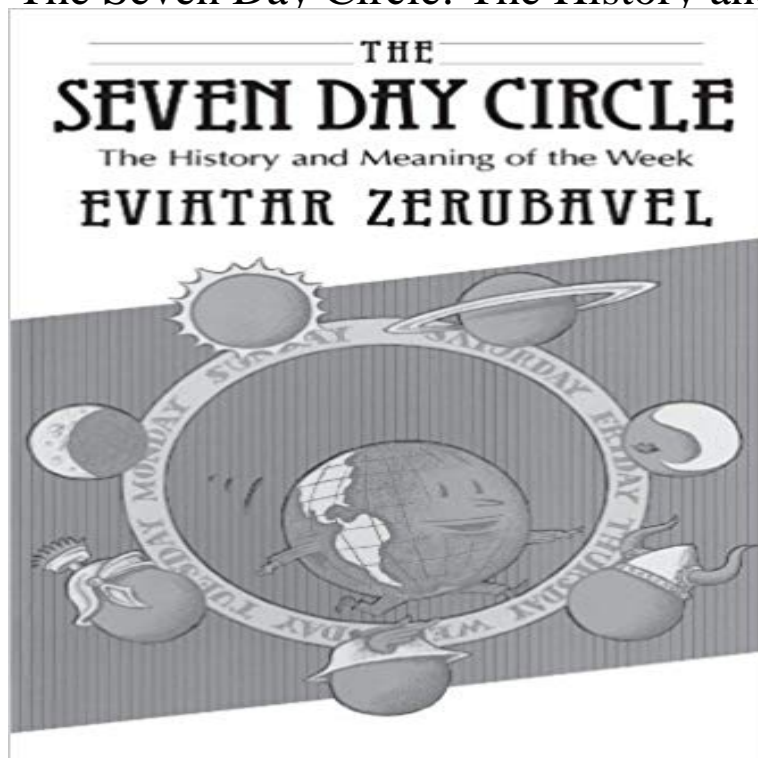


The Seven Day Circle: The History and Meaning of the Week
